AAUW Greensboro will fund two scholarships for college women to attend the **National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL)** along with nearly 1,000 college women from every state and from around the world, from **May 28–30, 2015, at the University of Maryland, College Park, MD.**

Eligible candidates will be undergraduate and graduate students in good academic standing who have at least one academic year left in their program. Preference will be given to undergraduate applicants.

Application process: **Applications are due February 28, 2015 (March 1 is a Sunday).**

In a written document (maximum 500 words) or through some type of multi-media (videos no longer than 3 minutes), applicants will address the following prompt:

Why are you interested in attending this program, what do you anticipate getting out of it, and what do you plan to do with it (e.g., come back and do a campus project, create an advocacy or informational video; conduct a workshop, other advocacy efforts, etc.)?

Also, students must submit a letter of recommendation by a faculty/staff member from their campus. All application materials should be sent to Dr. Kimberly Kappler Hewitt at kkhewitt@uncg.edu. Selection decisions will be made by the end of March, 2015.
