On December 22, Cherrie Wheaton, Laura Tew, and Libby Haile attended a meeting of the Commission on the Status of Women at the Greensboro Cultural Center. Our purpose was to learn more about CSW and to share with the commissioners the mission and activities of the Greensboro Branch of AAUW.

The mission of the **City of Greensboro Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)** is to improve the quality of life for women in Greensboro.

Commissioners serve three-year terms and work with local, state and national organizations, communities, and businesses on issues that affect the quality of life for women. The commission makes recommendations to City Council for actions it deems necessary to improve and uphold the opportunities for all people regardless of gender. The next CSW meeting is January 27, 6 PM, at Room 203 Greensboro Cultural Center, 200 N. Davie Street.

Deborah Goddard was appointed Chair of CSW in October 2015. As a social worker for 22 years, Deborah is very familiar with the plight of women and children who face various health and social issues in Greensboro. She has also worked closely with the nonprofit sector as well as local government at the Department of Health and Human Services in Greensboro. She is an active volunteer at the Women's Resource Center, having facilitated the Self Awareness/Empowerment Workshops and currently serving as a Community Resources Counselor.

Deborah earned her BSW in Social Work at North Carolina A&T State University and her Masters Degree in Human Services & Executive Leadership at Liberty University. She is a 2011 Graduate of the Greensboro City Academy; 2012 Graduate of Guilford County Citizens Academy and 2014 Graduate of IMPACT Greensboro, which is funded by the Community Foundation of Greater Greensboro and offered at The Center for Creative Leadership.

Deborah is excited about her role and about the opportunities of the CSW to make a difference in the lives of women.
