NCCWSL 2015 STUDENT REPORTS

Emalie Ashe The campus enrichment project I chose to develop after I returned from NCCWSL was to start a feminist student organization. After an organizational meeting, the name FACTS was agreed upon. FACTS stands for Feminist Activists for Change in Today's Society, and we currently have 26 members. Spring semester we are involved in planning and celebrating International Women's Day at the High Point YWCA, and have planned a documentary screening and discussion panel for the film "Salam Neighbor." Our organization meets bi-weekly, and is on the way to becoming a chartered organization on High Point University's campus

The deadline for applications was March 1, and a committee of AAUW members chaired by Dr. Margaret Curtis will be meeting to review applications and select recipients. The highly acclaimed annual conference, which is co-sponsored by National AAUW, is held at the University of Maryland - College Park. Attendees have the opportunity to choose among numerous workshops, be inspired at the Women of Distinction Banquet, benefit from one of the nation's premier, graduate and career fairs, and take advantage of daily networking opportunities.

NC A&T State University held a **Smart Start Salary Negotiation Workshop** in February. Participants included young women - freshmen to grad students, representing majors in biology, psychology and electrical & civil engineering. With AAUW Greensboro member Brandy Propst as the Facilitator, the young women focused on the importance of negotiating for pay equity in their first professional positions, the value of budgeting and tips related to interviewing. The experience of role playing an interview was especially useful. The University Representative with AAUW, Dr. Margaret Kanipes, organized the workshop and welcomed everyone on behalf of the STEM Center of Excellence for Active Learning at A&T.
