Women in Non-Traditional Careers: Chair Tiffany Jacobs reported that "Girls Exploring Tools and Tech GETT" started with four students on October 6. Joe Rotundi, executive director of Forge Greensboro, and collaborators:---I am a Board Member of both AAUW Greensboro and the Forge Greensboro. The GETT program is part of a collaborative partnership with the Forge and the 3-D printing club is being conducted virtually by Forge instructors. Girls Exploring Tools and Tech, or G.E.T.T., is an initiative started by AAUW Greensboro WINc Committee Chair, Tiffany Jacobs. The Forge intends to be home base for G.E.T.T. and provide the majority of its programming.
