NICOLE SHERRILL-CORRY, Ph.D., President AAUW Salisbury Branch, is a compassionate and engaging professional who helps her audience through visualizing their change. She is an agent for change by assisting women to embrace their unique qualities and birthing their dreams.

Dr. Nicole hosts a variety of workshops on topics relating to empowerment, change, and success. She is dedicated to developing Power Women who walk into their destiny by fulfilling their dreams.

Dr. Nicole is also an advocate against domestic violence. She holds roundtable discussions to educate on the importance of knowing how this crippling issue impacts society. Once a victim but now a survivor, she teaches about the impact of domestic violence not only on the individual level, but a societal one. She states, "DV affects everyone, and it is important as a whole to address the issues in order to combat it."

Dr. Nicole is the creator of Women Embracing Excellence. WEE is a non-profit that helps women who are business owners. Dr. Nicole is also the owner of NSC Behavioral Concepts, a mental health and substance use agency that serves all populations. She is the author of *Advice from a Friend: The Importance of Me*; a life story that empowered her to be all she can. Dr. Nicole is a John Maxwell Certified Life Coach, Speaker, and Trainer.

Her greatest joy is empowering women to be all they can regardless of where they come from. Dr. Nicole's motto is "***be the change you want to see in others***".



MICHELE HOYMAN, Ph.D., President AAUW Orange, Durham, Chatham Branch, is an Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. In addition, she is an adjunct faculty member in the School of Government's Master of Public Administration Program. Her teaching includes a variety of political science courses at the undergraduate and graduate level. She received her doctorate in political science from the University of Michigan in 1978. She received an AAUW dissertation fellowship in 1978.
